### Overview

It will help you to identify the common fire hazards in the workplace; identify the benefits of adequate fire risk assessment and the matters which should be addressed when undertaking a basic fire risk assessment; and outline the basic principles of fire prevention and fire controls in the workplace.

### Program Content and Key Areas

#### The common fire hazards in the workplace: hazards of electricity:

- ✓ The causes of fire: fire triangle, sources of ignition, fuel and oxygen in a typical workplace
- ✓ The classification of fires by fuel source
- ✓ The common causes and consequences of fires in workplaces

#### Fire risk assessment:

- ✓ The role and benefits of adequate fire risk assessment

#### Fire prevention and controls:

- ✓ Control measures to minimise the risk of fire in a workplace; elimination of, or reduction in, the use and storage of flammable and combustible materials, control of ignition sources, fuel and sources of oxygen, systems of

work and good housekeeping

- ✓ Fire detection, fire warning and fire fighting equipment; portable fire fighting equipment: siting, maintenance and training requirements, extinguishing media: water, foam, dry powder, vaporising liquids, gaseous
- ✓ Means of escape: doors, emergency lighting, exit and directional signs, assembly points
- ✓ Emergency evacuation procedures: role of fire marshals, fire drills, roll call, provisions for vulnerable people
- ✓ Issues associated with shared premises
